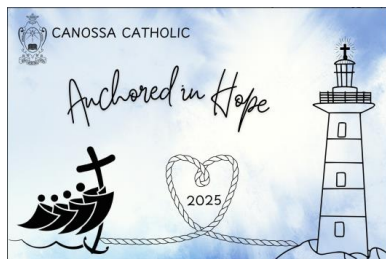

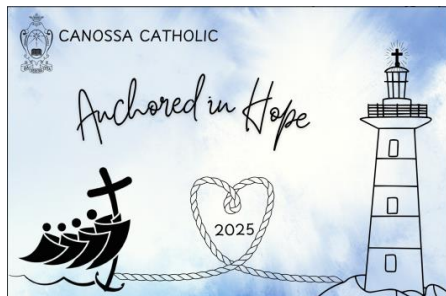

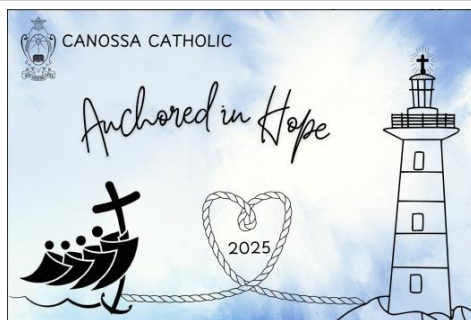

P1 Registration Exercise 2025 – Phase 1 Registration

Phase 1 registration is for a Singapore Citizen (SC) or Permanent Resident (PR) child born between 2 January 2019 and 1 January 2020 (both dates inclusive) and has a sibling studying in our school.

For the 2025 P1 Registration Exercise (2025 P1 Ex), parents who are registering their younger child under Phase 1 are to register during the Phase 1 registration period in early July 2025.

If your child is a non-SC / non-PR and thus not eligible for Phase 1, please submit an online indication of interest in end May/early June 2025.

More updates on the 2025 P1 Ex will be provided on the MOE P1 website (<https://www.moe.gov.sg/primary/p1-registration>) by May 2025.

Direct School Admission for Secondary Schools (DSA-Sec)

The Direct School Admission for Secondary Schools (DSA-Sec) will be open for application from 11am, 7 May 2025 to 3pm, 3 June 2025.

Primary 6 Students' Involvement in Non-School Based Activities

Please submit the documents (photocopy of the certificate) to your Singapore child's form teacher by 9 May 2025, Friday. Valid non-school based activities will then be recorded.

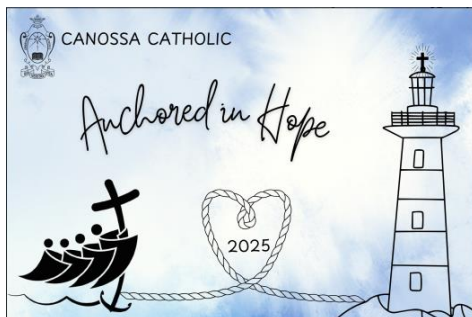
Travel Declarations

To ensure that schools continue to be a healthy and safe environment for all, we require parents/ guardians to make a travel declaration for your child/ ward if he/ she will be travelling for the holidays.

To make a travel declaration for your child/ ward via Parents' Gateway (PG), go to [SERVICE > DECLARE > TRAVELS]. For travel during the school holidays, indicate both the country and city of travel, and any city of transit, by 31 May 2025. Only one parent is required to make the declaration.

If your child/ ward is not travelling during the holidays, no action is required. When planning your travel, please refer to <https://www.ica.gov.sg/enter-transit-depart> for more information and updates.

If there is a change in travel plan(s) after declaration, please submit a new travel declaration via PG if there is a change in travel destination or inform the school if the travel plan(s) are cancelled.

He won 2nd and 5th place in 200m and 100m dash finals respectively in the Under 12 men.



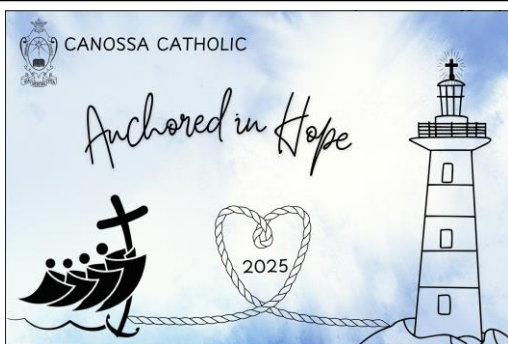
13th Singapore Inter-School Diving Championships

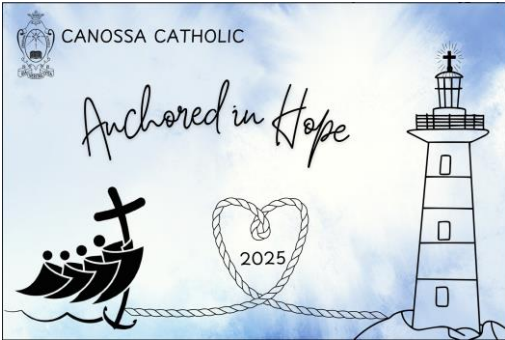
